Dear Secretary Foxx:

The Puerto Rico Science, Technology and Research Trust (Trust hereafter) is pleased to provide this letter in support of the application of the Puerto Rico Infrastructure Financing Authority (PRIFA) for funding from the TIGER VI program. Should this proposal be successfully awarded by the US Department of Transportation to PRIFA, the Trust is committed to providing \$11.1 million in matching funding.

This project will have an important and direct impact upon the Trust's mission, by positively enhancing the Science City Urban Infrastructure Project. This, in turn, is a signature economic development effort of the Government of Puerto Rico to transform a 67 acre land, consisting of the former state prison compound and public lands and intersected by major urban thoroughfares and Puerto Rico's first mass transit rail line, and replace it with San Juan's Science City, an urban infrastructure project tied to the creation of the San Juan Knowledge Corridor.
